Students who reside further than ten (10) kilometres from the college may be considered for an award for travel allowance, subject to the availability of funds. Students who use public transport may be considered for an award for transport allowance, subject to the availability of funds. Students who do not have a cell phone or a cell phone number or an email address may be considered for an award for transport allowance, subject to the availability of funds.

Students whose home address is further than forty (40) kilometres from the college may be considered for an award for accommodation allowance, subject to the availability of funds.

Documentation to be submitted includes **rental address, monthly amount, name and contact number of landlord.**

Students will be held responsible for the payment of the tuition and other fees until the bursary is paid to Westcol.

Once a bursary is paid, fees will be refunded.

Students will be notified of the outcome of the bursary application by NSFAS.

Students must wait for the approval by the National Student Funding Scheme (NSFAS).
